Literacy

This half term, children will explore a range of traditional tales, picture books and cartoons through Drawing Club. They will use these stories to develop their imagination and practise writing sentences using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. Children will also apply their phonics knowledge to help them spell words independently.

Geography

Children will use maps, atlases, globes and songs to locate and name the world's seven continents and five oceans. They will develop their understanding of the world and begin to recognise where the continents and oceans are located.

Mathematics:

Children will begin the half term by exploring numbers and place value within 10. They will practise counting, reading, writing and representing numbers, identify one more and one less, and compare and order numbers within 10. Some lessons will take place outdoors, allowing children to develop their understanding through practical games and activities.

PHSE

In this unit, children will learn about belonging and feeling safe within their class community. They will explore how to make their classroom a positive and welcoming place where everyone can learn. Pupils will recognise and celebrate their achievements and begin to understand how their choices can affect themselves and others.

Around the World



Art

Children will explore the creative artwork of Bridget Riley and learn how she used lines and repeated patterns to create different effects. They will experiment with a range of mark-making tools and techniques, creating straight, curved, wavy and zigzag lines. Children will then apply these skills to observational drawings and evaluate their work, explaining how Bridget Riley inspired their ideas.

PE:

Children will develop their fundamental movement skills, with a focus on improving balance, coordination and stability. They will explore different running speeds, practise changing direction and dodging, and develop confidence and control through hopping, skipping and jumping.

RE:

This half term, children will explore what it means to belong to a community. They will consider the groups they are part of and the positive things communities do. They will also learn about Christian baptisms and weddings and how these ceremonies show belonging within the Christian faith.

Science:

Children will identify and name a range of everyday materials and distinguish between objects and the materials they are made from. They will describe, compare and group materials according to their properties. Throughout the year, they will also observe and explore changes across the seasons.
