Literacy: Children will explore story writing linked to the Ancient Romans, through the book Escape from Pompeii. They will also create instructional texts, on how to be a Roman soldier. In poetry, children will enjoy writing riddles, limericks and humorous poems, building their confidence with wordplay and performing their work aloud.

PSHE:

For our PSHE learning, we will be looking at roles in the class and school. The children will write the class rules together, carefully considering what makes a supportive and successful learning environment for everyone. We will also be exploring how our actions affect ourselves and others.

Art:

This half-term, the children will be learning a range of drawing and shading techniques to create a landscape, still life and a self-portrait. We will be looking at using a light source and shading to create accurate observational drawings.

History: In history, the children will explore the Ancient Romans, learning who the Romans were, where they came from and when their empire existed. They will investigate how and why the Romans successfully invaded Britain, exploring the reasons behind the invasion and the impact of Roman rule on Britain.

Ancient Romans



RE:

This half-term the children will be focusing on the key question 'What is the Trinity' and why is it important for Christians? The children will learn about baptism, the Holy Trinity and prayer. They will explore why these are important to Christians and make their own comparisons.

Mathematics:

During this half-term we will be looking at place value, focusing on numbers with four digits. The children will be exploring how to add and subtract these numbers. Later in the term, we will be learning about division, multiplication and fractions. We will focus on consolidating 2/3/4/5/8/10 times table and learning the 7 timetables.

PE: The focus for our PE sessions this half-term will be 'Ball Skills'. The children will develop their throwing, catching, dribbling and aiming skills and apply them in a range of activities. The children will also explore the team sport of 'Tag Rugby'. During this unit, they will learn how to attack, defend and work effectively as a team.

Science:

During this half-term, the children will be identifying how sounds are made and finding patterns between the volume of sound and the strength of the vibrations. They will explore how sound becomes fainter the greater the distance from the source.
